SDXA - 05 august 2011

the meeting was called to order by our president WA1PMA, Wayne, at 19:00 local time.

secretary's report by WA0WWW, jay W, minutes for july are on the web page. K70X motioned to approve, WV7Y 2nd; motion passed.

treasurer's report by K7GS, Gary. we brought in \$50 (dues) and had some expenses for a net gain of about \$17. N5AR motioned to approve, K7OX 2nd; motion passed. VP's report by WX7B, Chris, introduced our special quest

old business:

- the NAQP RTTY contest with SDXA1, SDXA2 and SDXA3 teams was considered an outstanding success. we will consider more of these in the future. (the secretary being a member of SDXA3 who came in last, will only say, we had one less person...; hey no big deal it was a blast and fun!!!)
- WA1PMA asked for a motion to approve the proposed published updates to the club's constitution and bylaws; WS7I motioned, K7AWB 2nd, then discussion.
 - 2 questions were asked for some clarification on how the constitution approached the DXCC membership and non-DXCC membership and the wording around them and was some of meant to be saying SDXA. the 2nd question is why the 2 levels of membership and we discussed about the history of the club is for the encouragement of the DXCC, yet all should be able to vote which is a big change this time around. both questions looked to be answered okay.
 - the vote was made and was passed unanimously.
 - K7KB will post on the website and WA0WWW will record in the club's files accordingly.
- PNWDX convention 2013 by us in Spokane
 - need to give some direction to those going to the PNWDX convention in a few weeks, as the PCNWDX club officers get together and will be asking us if we are on for 2013.
 - even though some interest by SDXA membership to help out, no one has volunteered to chair. with recent discussions and no chair, the club's direction to WX7B who will be at the convention is that SDXA would like to pass and not host the 2013 PCNWDX convention.
 - there was a discussion that the EWA DX association out of the tri-cities might be interested to help out and maybe we can help them. open topic yet.
- are we interested to contribute \$1000 and buy a tent/station at the 2014 WRTC in MA?
 - WX7B will poll the other DX clubs at the convention and see if there is interest to split the \$1000 tent sponsorship. if not all 4 or 5 want to chip in we might have to consider putting in a little more, so tbd and we would discuss later.
 - $\circ~$ W0CG, Geoff will give a quick presentation at an upcoming meeting what this is all about.
- we discussed about a possible club dinner the evening of the Spokane Hamfest. after some discussion we will pass on that this year.

It also covered Top Band propagation and antennas. Jim typically runs QRP and works several of SDXA members each December during the ARRL 160 contest. Thanks much Jim!

my sketchy notes from the 160m presentation.

- 160m is not HF (3-30MHz), it is actually MF (0.3-3MHz)
- need to know the propagation to do DX, unlike 20m when you pretty much just get on.
- low noise receive antenna will help a lot, unlike the other bands.
 - \circ receiving loop that is 5 to 6' in diameter, needs to be adjustable as very narrow in bandwidth
 - $_{\odot}$ beverage, that only needs to be 5 to 10' off the groun, but needs to be a full wavelength long. it is directional
- not all countries have the full band, and some have very limited spectrum. be sure you know these. that said, 1830 to 1835 is the normal DX window.
- you want k<2 for the best 160m dx
- there is a 20-40min window at sunrise gray line
- spring and fall can be better than mid-winter, due to D-layer absorbtion
- north-south paths are better at times than east-west due to the electron gyro frequency. get a map of the world for seeing this.
- late night / early morning is much better then late evening. it takes time for the D layer absorption to decrease.
- PropLab is only propagation program for <3MHz (MF) it is extremely difficult to use.
- horz dipole < 1/10 wavelegnth off the ground not so good.
- verts < ¼ wavelength are not so good (very poor efficiency)
- when using the MFJ 259 antenna analyzer, you may need to filter out the AM broadcast, it can cover your readings.
