treasurer's report provided by K7GS, Gary; income was \$138.00 (dues and refreshments) – expenses were \$250.23 (dues and supplies). for the convention books they are closed and we were black, not as black as before, but met our goal not to loose and we have seed money for next time. the overall total is doing fine.

- question: how do we support DX peditions when asked? \rightarrow the answer is we donate and support the N. CA DX Foundation and then they divvy out to the different DXpeditions.
- for our convention Paypal, we will keep it and connect it to our normal account, then we can have dues submitted via pay pal.

TU: the prez said a big thank you to Randy, K7TQ, for all he did to keep the SDXA in the rotation for the DX conventions and the tremendous job he did with the convention, a wonderful success. Thanks Randy!!

VP's report by K7TQ, Randy; he focused on the convention. 164 paid attendees, 2 less than 2009 which was a record for all the PCNWDx conventions. a lessons learned is to account up front for a 19% service and sales tax charge for hotels that added up. Randy went on with a few more lessons learned and also thanked his convention staff for all they did. on to 2017.

- \circ one suggestion is should we look at other clubs and see what we learn.
- o at the officers meeting earlier, it was suggested it should go in the by-laws, this was mentioned and no one agreed or disagreed. to make changes to the by-laws it is to be brought up at a meeting (this meeting) and then voted on by a quorum at the next meeting.

 Section 1 The Bylaws shall provide for regular and special membership meetings. One quarter (1/4) of the members in good standing in attendance at any meeting shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of official Association business. (today we have 44 voting members, so a quorum is 11.)

 ARTICLE VII Amendments

Section 1 The Constitution and/or Bylaws may be amended by a two-thirds vote of the voting members present at a regular meeting. Proposals for amendments offered shall be submitted and read at a regular membership meeting, and shall be discussed and voted on at the following regular membership meeting.

o the proposal:

Should the Club, SDXA, need to use an Item from a members personal inventory as there is no other way to proceed without it for a club function, a decision will need to be made by the officers of SDXA in writing to agree to cover the cost of repair and/or replacement of such item if it is damaged while being used for the SDXA's event. This means the Officers of SDXA have to agree on an item or items use as well as the fact the club can afford to repair or replace the item as needed. This does not supersede or replace any member's general agreement from bringing something for use during Field Day or any other event at the members own wish to do so. Every member needs to fully understand that anything not covered in writing has no warranty from the club nor is the SDXA to be held responsible for any such usage.
