



Contests Tips & Helps

- 1. Print out a copy of the Contest rules.
- 2. Find the exact start and end time of the contest
- 3. Find out how much time you can operate and what time you must have off
- 4. For each contest find what the value is of each:
 - Contact
 - Multiplier

- 5. Decide on your objective:
 - Finding new DX countries
 - Beat your last years score
 - Work for only a limited number of hours
 - Go for your highest score possible

- 6. Select and test your contest software, radios and antennas out before the contest.
- 7. Decide if you are going to:
 - Run
 - Search and Pounce
 - Some of both

- 8. Develop your strategy
 When are you going to work
 - Europe?
 - Asia and Pacific?
 - Caribbean?
 - South America?

What band are your going to use when? When will you sleep or take breaks?

- 9. If you are going to use spotting, how will you set it up (filters) for the contest?
- 10. Try to get on a few days before the contest and check:
 - Band conditions
 - When different parts of the world are on

- 11. The week of the contest download the current versions of
 - Countries files
 - Super Check Partial
- 12. Set up macros and/or voice messages
- 13. Set up ContestOnlineScore in your contest software.

During the Contest:


- 1. Keep you contact a brief as possible. Do not use any extra words.
- 2. Use standard phonetics
- 3. Use 59 or 599 for all signal reports
- 4. If you miss something, ask only for what you missed

After the Contest:

- 1) Produce your Cabrillo File
- 2) Send it in to the Contest Sponsor (The email address will always be in the rules)
- 3) Share your score on SDXA@groups.io
- 4) Post your contest scores to <u>3830scores.com</u>
- 5) Make a copy of your score for your records






