Question #1: What interface are you using between your radio and computer/logging software for FSK? (It needs to be able to control and key your radio)

Recommended Steps for getting started:

Step #1: Get you interface setup between radio and computer

Step #2: Get your RTTY software setup -- NOTE: Make sure it sends and receives RTTY

Step #3: Download the suggested function keys for the first contest you will be operating.

Step #4: Operate a contest with the minimal numbers of windows. In N1MM those windows would be a) Entry Window, b) one Digital Interface Window, and c) Check Window. In this contest you will learn how to tune the radio, how to visually eliminate the extra character clutter in the Digital Interface, and how to use your function keys. When you come across these operators, work them, then stick around for a couple of minutes and observe how they operate. The operators to watch are A) AA5AU, Don located in LA, B) W6SX, Hank located in CA, and C) N3QE, Tim located in MD. Have fun and learn.

Step #5 Add the Bandmap window, the Available Mults window, and the telnet window then repeat Step 4. With the Telnet window it will be easier to find the three great operators so be sure to observe how they operate.

Step #6: Add a second digital interface window and learn the keyboard or mouse shortcuts to make operating easier. Operate more contests.

Step #7: Get all your components to work together (VE7CC, Rotator controller, SWR/Power/ Antenna switching, Amp, etc.)

Step #8: By now you will have sufficient operating experience to be on your own.
